

Frequently asked Questions About Online Schooling For Moorish Children

1. How many hours do students spend completing online coursework each day and week?

The virtual school day may last approximately seven to eight hours, including live instruction, independent assignments, breaks, lunch, and other scheduled activities. Students generally complete approximately 30 to 32 hours of instruction and coursework each week. The schedule may vary according to the student's grade level and academic needs.

2. What are some examples of typical assignments and deadlines?

Assignments may include homework, reading, written exercises, research projects, presentations, quizzes, tests, and group activities. Homework may be assigned daily, depending on the instructor and subject. Each instructor will provide students with assignment instructions and due dates. Students are assessed regularly to measure their comprehension and academic progress.

3. Are the school's expectations similar to those of a traditional school?

Online Schooling for Moorish Children maintains its own educational standards, philosophy, curriculum, and expectations. We do not measure our program by comparing it to traditional learning institutions. Our program provides a structured and academically rigorous learning environment designed to meet the educational, cultural, and developmental needs of our students.

4. How can I track my child's academic progress?

Parents are expected to remain actively involved in their child's education from the beginning of the school year. Instructors submit monthly reports to the school administrator, and students receive progress reports each semester. Parents and students must also complete a folder check on the last Wednesday of every month. Parents may contact their child's instructors when they have questions or concerns.

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5. Is there a webinar that explains the school's program?

Yes. An orientation meeting is held at the beginning of each school year. The orientation explains the school's program, rules, procedures, academic expectations, and parent responsibilities. A recording of the orientation webinar is provided to parents as a reference and reminder.

6. Does the school provide organizational support and reminders?

Yes. Students are required to maintain a homework journal to record assignments, deadlines, and important reminders. Time management and organizational skills are taught at every grade level, beginning with preschool.

7. What happens if my child misses an assignment deadline?

The parents will be notified when a student misses an important deadline. The student must contact the appropriate instructor to determine which assignments are missing and what steps are required to become current. Parents are expected to help the student complete the instructor's recovery plan.

8. Does the curriculum include social and emotional learning activities?

Yes. In addition to academics, students participate in activities that encourage communication, self-advocacy, teamwork, responsibility, and social development. These activities may include group projects, individual consultations, and Community Day, which is held on the last Thursday of each month.

9. How do students interact with one another? Are field trips available?

Students communicate through online classes, text-based discussions, school-approved social media activities, and group projects. Parents may also arrange educational field trips with family members, friends, or other

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students. Field-trip permission forms and proper documentation must be submitted for the activity to be considered for class credit.

10. How does the school address behavioral concerns?

The school provides student counseling and schedules conferences with parents when behavioral concerns arise. Students are expected to demonstrate respect, self-control, and appropriate conduct. Disrespectful behavior toward students, instructors, parents, administrators, or guests is not tolerated.

11. How are parents kept informed?

Parents receive information through email, telephone calls, text messages, progress reports, conferences, and other school communications. Parents are encouraged to contact the school or their child's instructors whenever they have questions about attendance, assignments, behavior, or academic progress.

12. Is the school accredited?

Yes. Online Schooling for Moorish Children is accredited by the Moorish National Erudition and Education Accreditation Council, Inc.

13. Does tuition increase every year, or will the monthly payment remain the same?

Tuition is reviewed annually and may change depending on economic conditions, school operating expenses, and the amount of donations received. Families will be notified in advance if a tuition adjustment becomes necessary.

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14. Do preschool students need the same school supplies as older students?

No. School supply requirements are based on each student's grade level and courses. Parents should follow the supply list provided for their child and contact the child's instructors before purchasing additional materials.

15. Do students receive report cards or progress reports?

The school's progress report serves as the student's report card. It includes grades, academic-performance information, and instructor comments. Progress reports are issued for Levels 1B, 1C, 1D, and all students in Levels 2 and 3.

16. Is there a buddy system program for students who live in the same city?

The school has not established a formal city-based buddy program at this time. However, parents and students are encouraged to communicate, develop appropriate educational connections, and participate in school-approved group activities.

17. What assessments are used to measure student performance and academic growth?

Students' complete classroom assignments, quizzes, tests, projects, and annual end-of-year assessments. These evaluations help instructors measure student comprehension, performance, and academic growth. Upper-level students also receive SAT preparation and college and university readiness support.

18. How does the school help students transition from high school to college or trade school?

Graduating students receive official transcripts documenting their completed courses, grades, and credits. These transcripts may be submitted when applying to colleges, universities, trade schools, apprenticeship

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programs, or other postsecondary institutions. Students should also review the individual admission requirements of each institution.

19. Will students be prepared for state assessments, diplomas, college, or trade school?

The curriculum is designed to provide students with academic knowledge, practical skills, discipline, and critical-thinking abilities needed for future success. State testing, diploma, college-degree, and trade-school requirements may vary by jurisdiction and institution. Families should verify the specific requirements that apply to their student's educational goals.

20. Are uniforms required for all students?

Yes. The school maintains a strict uniform policy. Students must appear in the required uniform during online classes and designated school activities. The uniform policy promotes school pride, discipline, neatness, unity, and professional appearance.
