

Online School Supply List Mid & Upper Levels

To participate successfully in virtual instruction, every student must have a quiet, organized learning area and dependable access to the required technology and school supplies listed below.

Parents and guardians should label applicable materials with the student's full appellation. Supplies should be replenished throughout the school year as needed.

REQUIRED TECHNOLOGY

1 desktop computer or laptop

A tablet or cellular telephone should not be used as the student's primary classroom device. The computer should have:

- A functioning camera
- A functioning microphone
- Updated internet browser
- Word-processing capability
- PDF-reading capability
- Sufficient storage for assignments and educational files
- The ability to participate in live virtual classes

2. Dependable high-speed internet connection

3. noise-canceling headset with a microphone — mandatory

The headset must be available during all live classes to reduce background noise and allow the student to communicate clearly.

4. all-in-one printer with scanning and copying capabilities

5. Printer ink or toner sufficient for the school year

Families should keep at least one replacement of black ink or toner cartridge available.

6. 3 reams of standard 20-pound printer paper

Each ream generally contains 500 sheets. Families may purchase additional paper during the year as needed. Twenty packages are not necessary at the beginning of the school year.

7. 1 USB flash drive with at least 32 GB of storage

The flash drive may be used to back up assignments, projects, lessons, and school records. Students may also use an approved cloud storage service.

8. Surge protector

A surge protector is strongly recommended to protect the student's computer, printer, and other electronic equipment.

REQUIRED WRITING SUPPLIES

9. 12 No. 2 pencils or mechanical pencils with replacement lead
10. 2 pencil erasers
11. 1 handheld pencil sharpener, if standard pencils are used
12. 4 blue or black ink pens
13. 2 red pens for corrections and editing
14. 5 highlighters in different colors
15. 1 pencil case or supply container
16. 1 package of lined notebook paper
17. 2 packages of plain copy paper, in addition to printer paper if needed for projects
18. 1 package of index cards
19. 1 package of sticky notes
20. 1 pair of student scissors
21. 1 twelve-inch ruler with standard and metric measurements

NOTEBOOKS AND COURSE ORGANIZATION

22. 6 lined composition notebooks or spiral notebooks

Suggested subjects:

1. Language Arts
2. Mathematics
3. Science
4. Social Studies or Civics
5. Foreign Language
6. Elective, Theology, Financial Literacy, or Career Readiness

Additional notebooks may be required according to the student's course schedule.

23. 1 academic planner or homework journal

Only one well-organized academic planner is necessary. Students should use it to record assignments, tests, projects, meetings, and due dates for all subjects.

24. 3 one-inch or one-and-one-half-inch binders

Suggested binder organization:

- Language Arts and Social Studies
- Mathematics and Science
- Electives, assessments, and reference materials

- 25. 3 packages of subject dividers
- 26. 8 pocket folders or file folders
- 27. 1 package of sheet protectors
- 28. 1 sturdy three-hole punch
- 29. 1 stackable file rack, portable file box, or designated shelf
This should be labeled by subject so the student can store and locate materials easily.

MATHEMATICS AND REFERENCE MATERIALS

- 30. 1 scientific calculator
Students enrolled in advanced mathematics may be required to purchase a graphing calculator. The instructor will provide the approved model when applicable.
- 31.1 unabridged dictionary or American Heritage Dictionary
A reputable digital dictionary may be used when approved by the instructor.
- 32. Access to a thesaurus-A printed or approved digital thesaurus is acceptable.

HEALTH AND DAILY CLASSROOM READINESS

- 33. 1 reusable water bottle of at least 16 ounces
Students should keep water nearby while attending virtual classes but should protect computers, books, and assignments from spills.
- 34. 1 timer or digital timekeeping device-A kitchen timer, desk timer, or computer timer may be used for timed assignments, independent reading, keyboarding practice, and study periods.
- 35. Comfortable, supportive chair and suitable desk or table
- 36. Adequate lighting
- 37. Quiet learning area with limited distractions

COURSE-SPECIFIC SUPPLIES

The following materials should not be purchased unless an instructor assigns a class, experiment, or project requiring them:

- Art sketch pad
- Washable markers
- Colored pencils

- Glue stick
- White glue
- Clear tape
- Additional binders or folders
- Laminating sheets
- Urine or saliva pH testing strips
- Disposable testing cups
- Specialized science-laboratory materials
- Graphing calculator
- Additional printer paper
- Additional USB storage devices

Parents and guardians will receive advance notice when course-specific materials are required.

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITY

Students in Mid and Upper-Level grades are expected to:

1. Keep their learning area clean and organized.
2. Bring all required materials to each virtual class.
3. Charge and test their computer and headset before class.
4. Record assignments and deadlines in their academic planner.
5. Save and back up digital assignments regularly.
6. Store completed work in the appropriate folder or binder.
7. Notify a parent, guardian, or instructor when supplies need to be replenished.
8. Use all technology and school materials responsibly.

Individual instructors may request additional materials based on a student's grade level, course selection, laboratory activities, art projects, or special assignments. Parents and guardians should wait for written instructions before purchasing course-specific materials.
